E-Notify System

e-Notify sends subpoenas/notifications for different types of appointments. These include criminal, juvenile, parking, traffic and other miscellaneous events that are related to court, such as depositions or meetings with private attorneys. On October 31, 2010, Miami Dade County will go paperless, all subpoenas/notifications will be sent using the e-Notify system.
