JOINT ROUNDTABLE ON YOUTH SAFETY WORKING GROUPS

On Friday, January 18, Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos A. Gimenez together with Miami-Dade County Public Schools Superintendent Alberto M. Carvalho, hosted a joint roundtable discussion on Youth Safety with Miami-Dade Mayors and Police Chiefs to address the recent tragedy in Connecticut as well as random violence against youth in our community.

Working groups will be formed to develop strategies for youth safety throughout Miami-Dade County. It was requested that each Police Chief attend one of the several working groups, or assign a representative for your respective agency. The groups will meet weekly over the next month to identify resources, encourage and increase community engagement, and increase safety in the schools and the community. Sgt.
