Section 2-193, "Deferred retirement option plan (DROP)", of Division Section 2. 2. - "Pension Plan", of Article V. - "Employee Benefits", of Chapter 2. - "Administration", of the Town Code is hereby amended, as follows: Chapter 2 – Administration \*\*\* Article V. – Employee Benefits \*\*\* Division 2. – Pension Plan Sec. 2-193. – Deferred retirement option plan. A deferred retirement option plan ("DROP") is hereby created as follows: (1) Eligibility. A member of the plan who reaches normal retirement age shall be eligible to participate in the DROP ("eligible member"). An eligible member may participate in the DROP for a maximum of 60 months from the date the 

eligible to participate in the DROP ("eligible member"). An eligible member may participate in the DROP for a maximum of 60 months from the date the member reaches his or her normal retirement date. Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, if an eligible member has reached his or her normal retirement date on or before the date the DROP plan is implemented, then the eligible member shall have 60 days from the date the DROP plan is implemented to elect in writing to participate in the DROP for the maximum DROP participation period of 60 months. Effective October 1, 2022, the maximum period of DROP participation shall be 72 months for sworn law enforcement officers and communications operators. Effective October 1, 2023, the maximum period of DROP participation shall be 72 months for general and senior management members, including current DROP participants, who are not members of a collective bargaining unit.
