

# Bid for Town Community Center Awarded

At a special Town Commission meeting on December 15, 2009, the Surfside Town Commission unanimously voted to select the firm of West Construction to be the general contractor for the new Community Center and Aquatic Facility.

After scaling down the original plan to a one-story facility that will allow for future expansion and a month-long bid process, West Construction was selected as the lowest, most responsible and responsive bidder. The total cost of the project will be \$5 million which will be taken from Town reserves. There is no tax increase.

The vote of the Town Commission authorizes the Town Manager and Town Attorney to negotiate a contract with West Construction. The Town Commission will have the opportunity to approve the contract at a future meeting. It is estimated that the project will be completed before 2011.
