Town Manager's Message

Rather than focus on a central theme this month, this message will include a number of happenings that you should know about:

• Congratulations to Duncan Tavares for his promotion to Tourism, Economic Development & Community Services Director. Duncan has taken on broad new responsibilities over the past six months and has handled a number of special projects with excellence that sets a standard for our Surfside workforce.

• Welcome to Bill Evans as our new Public Works Director (see page 3). Bill has vast experience in Public Works and will bring a new level of attention to detail that will help our Town to shine and make us all proud.

•The Community Center construction is coming along with all the complex problems of completing a building being solved. Look to enjoying this building this summer with a full complement of opening events and activities. Also, check out the Buy a Brick program to have your special message built into the walkway for the Center (see page 2). Thanks to Cheryl Arnold and Pam Behar who are heading up this program.

• The first meeting of the Downtown Vision Committee was held and there was near unanimity in support of a beefed up Code Compliance program. Letters have gone out to all businesses and property owners in the downtown area notifying that we will be inspecting and coming up with a list of violations. We hope for voluntary compliance and will work closely with the business people to "clean up fix up" and make our downtown look and feel better. Longer term solutions will be discussed over the next few months.

•The Town will be implementing a commercial vehicle parking ordinance which restricts parking such vehicles on the streets after certain hours in single family neighborhoods. There will be a 60 day warning period. Our goal is to resolve a long standing issue with a reasonable level of regulation.

•Spring Youth, Adult and Senior programs registration begins for the Parks and Recreation Department in March (See Page 4). Also check out summer camp registration.

• The Town Clerk's office in conjunction with the Building Department will soon implement a new document imaging and records retention program. We have nearly three million documents to image. When this is done all departments will have ready access to documents. We will save money on outside storage and




