## Town Manager's Message

As my 64th birthday approaches, I hope the readers of this message will bear with me. When you add a few years, too many pounds and a lot of grey hair, hopefully you have learned something and you feel compelled to share that experience and knowledge. The residents of the Town of Surfside are being bombarded with a fusillade of lies, distortions and half truths regarding the upcoming water, sewer and storm drainage project that is so vitriolic, personal rather than issue oriented and disrespectful of our residents, that I am compelled to clear the air. This brief message will not attempt to answer everything raised by this small group. That will be done separately, transparently, honestly and responsibly in the near future.

We learn from life experiences and I want to share two with you. My sister was born in 1939 eight years before me. She had a congenital heart defect which could not be cured by the miracle surgery that we have today. Her doctors said watch your weight, don't have more than two children, don't smoke and maintain a relaxed life style and you will be ok. She was overweight, had four children, smoked three packs a day and certainly was intense. She passed at age 55 and not a day goes by that she isn't in my mind.

A friend believed that the need for frequent oil changes was a fiction created by the Quick Change industry and therefore changed his oil about every 20,000 miles. When his engine blew up at 65,000 miles he wondered why.

What does this have to do with the Town of Surfside's water, sewer, storm drainage project. Pretty simple...these underground and invisible pipes are old, leaky and very risky. Sure, we can wait for another 20 years. Why not? Some of these pipes lasted for 70 years...to expect 20 more is certainly reasonable. Believe that and there is a bridge in Brooklyn for sale.

Good honest issue oriented debate is always welcome by the Town Commission and the Town staff. Personal attack, distortions, creation of wedge issues, going after a volunteer committee member's living, scare tactics and similar strategies simply have no place in an enlightened civil society or in Surfside. Let's hope the rhetoric and vitriol can be toned down and folks will regain responsibility and respect. This wonderful community has come too far and too much work has been done to develop a comprehensive fiscally responsible solution to the water, sewer storm drainage system problems to let a small but vocal group turn back the progress.

If you still think we don't need to replace/rebuild our system check out the March 24, 2011 Miami Herald article and see what happens when you have a major pipe break in a line that was approximately 70 years old. Better yet, drive by and see the damage and consider the cost.

## Watering Restrictions In Effect for Surfside

Because of current drought conditions, watering restrictions are in place for all municipalities, including Surfside. Residents may only water on this schedule:

• No watering between 10 a.m. - 4 p.m.

• For residents and businesses with odd-numbered addresses, lawn watering is permitted on Wednesdays and Saturdays, before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m.

 For residents and businesses with even-numbered addresses (including multi-family and homeowner associations) lawn watering is permitted on Thursdays and Saturdays, before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m.

• For new plantings and landscaping: 1st day: no restrictions. Day 2-30: Water in the time allowed on any day except Friday. Day 31-90: Water in the time allowed on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday. An entire irrigation system can only be used if more than 50 percent is new landscaping.

•Hand-watering with a hose fitted with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed for 10 minutes per day for landscape relief.

 Watering-in fertilizers and insecticides may be done for one application. For other applications, follow established watering days.

 Restrictions do not apply for car and boat washing, pressure cleaning, golf courses, users of reclaimed water and certain low volume irrigation systems.

Here is a very recent example of what aging infrastructure can cause next door in Miami Beach - an incident we want to avoid in the Town of Surfside.

March 24, 2011 . MIAMI BEACH WATER MAIN BURSTS; REPAIRS TO TAKE DAYS

Construction crews will likely remain in the La Gorce neighborhood of Mi-ami Beach until Saturday to repair the pipes and road damaged late Tuesday night when an underground water main erupted and flooded the area of 63rd Street and La Gorce Drive.

City spokeswoman Nan-nette Rodriguez said the busted 16-inch water pipe should be repaired and water flow restored by Thursday morning. Contractors, however, will remain in the area to repair a Florida De-partment of Transportation storm line also damaged in the deluge.

According to Rodriguez, engineers said the underground damage was severe because of the water pressure that burst from the

water main." It's the biggest break we've had in 17 years, she said.

The cost of the repairs and what caused the water main to burst about 10:30 p.m. Tuesday and spew inches of water onto the roadway are still unknown, she said. Police were rerouting traffic off Alton Road near the water main break Wednesday, and traffic delays are expected to continue in the area while crews

repair the pipe and roadway. DAVID SMILEY
