Manager's Message

My November 2011 Manager's Message contained a mistake. It stated that the approved millage for the FY 11/12 Budget had been reduced by .5000 mills. This was incorrect. Millage was reduced to 5.5000 from 5.6030. Chalk it up to working late, being nearly 65 years old or just not being infallible. Commissioner Karukin was the only person to catch it. Thanks to Michael for his incredible attention to detail and my apologies.

I promised to discuss two things in this message. The first was closing out the Community Center project. Closing out a project ensures the general contractor provides a quality building that meets all applicable codes as well as the requirements of the plans and specifications. This is done by staff and consultants preparing a "punch list" of items which require additional attention. The initial punch list contained 500 items (not unusual for a complicated building), which have been resolved. The Town will keep "retainage" from the general contractor, West Construction, until all items are completed. There are warranties on all major components and the performance bond will remain in place for 12 months after the Certificate of Occupancy was issued.

The second element of project closeout is financial in which West Construction, AECOM (the design firm) and CGA (the project manager) make claims for change orders valued up or down. The Town also makes claims. Over the life of this project, there were nearly 100 claims which have all been resolved amicably without the costly litigation in so many prior Town projects. The Town Commission on November 8, 2011 approved settlement of all claims at far less than the amount claimed and releases will be signed by all parties. Your Town team has completed the Community Center on time and within budget. Many thanks to Tim Milian, Parks and Recreation Director, Bill Evans, Public Works Director, Paul Gioia, Building Director and so many other folks who worked very hard to get this done.

My Manager's Message last month also promised to talk about the "vision thing." Vision means many things to many people. The creation of a vision in Surfside is a collaboration. We start with a citizen involved process. The Downtown Vision Advisory Committee (DVAC) is an example of concerned citizens (stakeholders) representing diverse interests developing a series of recommendations to enhance Downtown while preserving our small community feel. Ideas are brought forward by Staff, members of the Committee, elected officials, consultants or just folks in the audience. Discussion is robust, televised and agreed upon items are brought to the Planning and Zoning Board, the Town Commission or any other process that is required. The vision is collaborative with strong outreach to anyone wishing to participate. Many of the items
