Town Manager's Message

Last week was an amazing week for the Town of Surfside. Three longstanding contentious issues were resolved with dignity and respect, openness and transparency, and quality Staff work supporting sensitive and concerned policy making. This is a new standard for this wonderful town both expected by the Town Commission and demanded by our residents.

First, the 11-year legal battle regarding Young Israel's ability to build a place of worship on property the congregation owns at 96th Street between Abbott and Byron took an enormous step toward reaching closure. After public input, the Commission, on a four to one vote, approved a settlement agreement of this litigation. Town Attorney Lynn Dannheisser explained the history of the case and specific items included in the settlement. The leadership of Young Israel expressed their views, neighbors expressed their concerns and the members of the Town Commission voted after explaining their thought process. Now the rest of the process unfolds with meetings of the Development Review Group, the Development Impact Committee, the Planning and Zoning/Design Review Board and the Town Commission. These processes will resolve any issues not included in the Settlement Agreement and will focus on mitigating impacts of the project. All in all, a responsible resolution of a difficult issue that required compromise and stewardship of diverse interests.

The second determination by the Town Commission was to authorize the advertisement of a Request for Proposals for a Feasibility Study for a parking structure downtown. Two locations will be reviewed including the Abbott lot between 96th and 95th Street and the 94th Street lot on Harding. Feasibility studies are required to be independent to ensure that the bond market (if that alternate is chosen) or a public/private partnership investor has reliable information. This decision, again on a four to one vote, is a small but critical step in the process. The Town Commission made it clear in the discussion that no final decision to move forward has been made. It was also clear that the "small town feeling" of our community could not be compromised while the need to upgrade and refresh the mix of tenants which the parking structure would support was an important element of the Downtown Vision Advisory Committee process. Before anyone polarizes, remember that the maximum height this facility can be is three stories and there are many more deliberative steps which will be open to public input before any final decision is made.

The third action taken by the Town Commission was to authorize investigation of a partial refinancing of the \$16 million bond issue for the water, sewer and storm drainage project. There is the possibility that we can lower our interest rate to approximately 2.5 percent from the current 4.72 percent by using State of Florida loan

pool and funds provided by Bal Harbour for our share of the completed 16 inch force main under Collins Avenue from 96th Street to 73rd Street in Miami Beach. The lower interest could allow maintaining the current customer rates for a period of time, building up reserves against future rate increases, providing service to homes which we found to be in worse condition than originally anticipated and possibly implementing some of the alternate elements such as new street signs and tree planting. Once again Staff was authorized on a four to one vote, to take a hard look at all these options and bring back a recommendation. The Commission also made it clear that they did not want to support expanding the original scope of the project. This is how public policy should be made and it is how we strive to behave.

To close, let me congratulate the Grand Beach Surfside Hotel for beginning construction on their 347 room addition to our community and the 9501 Collins Avenue developer for beginning their seven luxury condominium project. To the people of Surfside and the Town Commission, thanks for the opportunity to manage this wonderful community.

Meet the Town Hall Front Office Staff








