

Message from the Town Manager

By the time you read this message, the Presidential Election will be upon us. This every-four-year event is so important that you are encouraged to vote by absentee, early vote in person or show up at the poll on November 6, 2012. We will do everything possible to keep parking convenient and to ensure a smooth flow to the polling location in the Town Commission Chambers.

Last month, I wrote about the three Town Charter amendments. They remain very important to ensure your rights as a citizen of Surfside, require Charter review every ten years and clarify land use provisions from an earlier Charter amendment. Miami Dade County Charter Amendments as well as State Constitution Amendments impact the future of both units of government and indirectly Surfside. These amendments are complicated and often result in an outcome which is opposite what they are titled on the ballot. Just like the recently defeated pro pit bull amendment, please study the language in advance and make your informed choice.

There is also a lot of news on Town issues. With the approval of the Surf Club project by the Town Commission, two funds will be created to enhance downtown (\$400,000) and build Parks and Recreation capital projects (\$500,000) including the potential second floor for the Community Center. Much more will follow on these opportunities. We have also received the proposal from FPL to underground the utilities throughout Town. The Administration will be making a recommendation to the Town Commission on this project in the next few months. The parking facility study is also nearing completion and will be presented to the Parking Structure Advisory Committee and the Town Commission in the near future. The seawall street end repair study is underway as is the traffic calming study. There will be a lot of community discussion on all these projects over the next few months.

Despite 92 inches of rain and two tropical storms so far this year, the water/sewer/storm drainage project is making rapid progress toward completion. The final water pipe (eight miles in total) has been put in place, the sewer repair/replacement is nearing completion and subcontractors are working on the three new storm water pumps and upgrades to the two sewer lift stations. The restoration crews continue to repair the 1149 driveways and replace sod. Finally, the Collins/Harding Avenue repaving FDOT project is nearly complete. The stamped asphalt crosswalks and some signage remains to be done. Your patience is certainly appreciated.

There is so much more to report, however, there is no more space. As always, thanks to you and the Town Commission for the opportunity to manage this wonderful community.

Special Business Parking Permits Available for Downtown Workers

Discounted business parking permits for downtown district employees are available for the 9400 Harding Avenue municipal parking lot across from Wells Fargo Bank. The cost is \$69.55 a month per vehicle, approximately one-third of the metered cost for an eighthour day, five days a week. The parking permit is valid seven days a week. Overnight parking is not permitted.

New High Tech Meters Offer More Options for Parking

No quarters? No problem.
Parking in Surfside will be more accomodating for residents as a pilot program will begin replacing the old meters with state-of-the-art solar-powered single meters that

accept credit and debit cards as well as coins. Thirty of the new meters, manufactured by IPS, will soon be installed throughout Surfside. There wil be no construction as they will be mounted on the existing meter posts.

"The new meters will bring our parking system upto-date," said Lt. Richard Williams. "These fit in with the popular new ticket kiosks serving our large parking lots."

In addition to the convenient new payment options, the new meters have wireless reporting to provide real-time statistics. The test will last 90 days and then a decision to buy the meters will be made.

Randy Starks Named Employee of the Month

Surfside Resident Bernardo Benes, a Man of 'Firsts'

Surfside resident Bernardo Benes has had an extraordinary life full of "firsts."

One of South Florida's first prominent Cuban exiles, he has been active as a lawyer, banker, journalist, civic and business leader and founder of a Cuban Jewish congregation. Perhaps he is known most for making history in 1978. In that year, he became the first major Cuban exile to meet with Fidel Castro, who he knew in his youth. These milestone meetings, totaling more than 100 hours, were called *diálogo* and have been the subject of several books and documentaries. Through Mr. Benes efforts, Castro ultimately freed 3,600 Cuban political prisoners. In subsequent years, he made 60 more trips to Cuba, serving as an unofficial liaison between the two countries during the Cold War.

Benes was born in Cuba in 1934 and graduated as an attorney and CPA from the University of Havana. He was a member of the law firm Bufete Zaydin and was a legal consultant to the Cuban Treasury Department.

In 1960, Benes was a part of the professional class that left Cuba and went into exile in Miami. He went to work for Washington Federal Savings and Loan on Miami Beach and eventually became Vice President.

"American banks took advantage of the new pool of Cuban professionals arriving in Miami," Benes recalled. "In turn, we started bringing in clients that we knew from home and the banking character of Miami changed drastically." In 1974, Benes and Carlos Dascal started Continental Natioanal Bank of Miami, the first Cubanowned bank in the U.S.

From 1965 to 1977 he served as a Vice President of the United Way of Dade County. In 1977, he founded United Way International and was a housing consultant to the Interamerican Development Bank and the United Nations.



He also co-founded the Cuban Hebrew Congregation on Miami Beach in 1961. Now called Temple Beth Shmuel, located at 1701 Lenox Avenue. In the 1960s and 1970s more than 900 families belonged.

He was given an Honorary Doctoral Degree in Human Relations in 1968 from St. Thomas University. In 1969,

the Republic of Panama awarded him The Vasco Nunez Balboa Decoration for his humanitarian contributions and in 1979, the order of the Vatican Decoration for Human Rights. He has also served as an adjunct professor at the University of Miami.

In 1991, his extensive papers were donated to the Cuban Heritage Collection of the UM Libraries.

The papers include correspondence, writings, notes, newspapers, magazines, clippings, reports, articles, books, photographs, memos, resumes and catalogs. It documents Dr. Benes' personal and professional activities with organizations such as the Cuban Hebrew Circle of Miami and the Greater Miami Jewish Federation.


