## Reflecting During Surfside's Busy Holiday Season

Surfside police went door-to-door to alert residents of the evacuation. After the storm, they checked on those who chose to stay. The Police also ensured that only Surfsiders could re-enter the Town after the storm, minimizing any crimes.

What will we do better? Clear and effective communication with residents, businesses and partners is critical. Hurricanes remain difficult to predict. Everyone must know their role and responsibility when situations quickly change. Preparation remains more important than ever. Plan on getting involved early in the planning and preparation of the 2018 hurricane season.

## Tree Trimming and Pruning

Landscape trees not only make homes and communities more beautiful, they also improve our environment and can increase the value of a property up to 20 percent. Trees are invaluable assets that need to be enhanced and protected. Proper pruning is a worthwhile investment.

When a tree or part of a tree breaks, it can cause extensive damage to people and property. A preventive pruning program is important to minimize the risks. Preventive or structural pruning is a process that can help promote healthy, strong trees. Research studies suggest that pruning trees significantly reduces trunk movement and damage when exposed to 120 mph winds.

Because proper pruning is complicated, national standards have been developed for the best methods and safety. Any potentially hazardous activity associated with climbing trees, using power tools, and especially working near electric lines should be left to qualified professionals who follow the national tree safety standards.

A tree removal/relocation permit is not required for the selective pruning or trimming of trees, provided the pruning is done according to the most recent American National Standards (ANSI) A-300 Standard Practices for Tree Care Operations.

However, excessive pruning of more than 25 percent of the tree's canopy (i.e. hat-racking, topping, etc.) and other activities (i.e. trunk girdling, excessive root cutting, use of tree-killing chemicals, etc.) constitutes a violation of Section 24-49 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Thinking about pruning/trimming your trees? Please hire only licensed and insured arborist that knows how to proper care and prune trees.



## **NEW WALKING-FRIENDLY STREETSCAPE TO BE TESTED**

The Town Commission approved to conduct a test of a new streetscape design on 89th and 90th Streets, between Harding and Hawthorne. The test consists of creating a safe pedestrian path and a green area in what is currently the paved area of those streets. Because width of the street will be narrowed during the test, the streets will be changed to a one-way system, with 90th street traffic moving from west to east and 89th Street traffic moving from east to west. The streets will be marked with paint to designate the pedestrian area as well as the green/parking area.

The test will run for 60 days, starting on the first week of December. At the end of the test period, staff will present a report to the Town Commission.



## 2018 PARKING PERMITS FOR THE 94 AND 95 BLOCKS OF BYRON AVENUE

The 2018 Byron Avenue Parking Permits are **ONLY** for residents and their guests on the 9400 & 9500 blocks of Byron Avenue. The application and permits are available at the Town of Surfside Police Department.

#### **REGISTRATION PROCESS**

- 1. Residents are required to complete the Registration Application available at the Police Department Communications Unit.
- 2. Residents must provide proof of residency. Examples include, but are not limited to:
  - Property tax bill
- Utility bill (FPL, water/sewer)
- Property rental or lease agreement
- Current Driver's License with Surfside address in the 9400 or 9500 block of Byron Avenue
- 3. There is a maximum of three parking permits per household. The decal will have a permit number and the specific location to use it.

NOTE THAT PARKING PERMITS ARE

• **NOT** valid in any other location

• Non-transferable



## COMMISSION ACTION AT THE NOVEMBER 14 MEETING

#### **RESOLUTIONS**

- 1. Approving with conditions a beach furniture permit application pursuant to section 86-31 of the Code of Ordinances.
- 2. Approving work authorizations to Calvin Giordano & Associates to provide general engineering services for traffic signal modifications at intersections along Harding Avenue and Abbott Avenue and 95th street.
- 3. Accepting a Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Enforcement Campaign Grant from the University of South Florida Board of Trustees in the amount of \$4,000.
- 4. Authorizing and approving the purchase of three Ford Police SUV Interceptor vehicles for the Police Department and expenditure of \$120,000 from the Fiscal Year 2017-18 budget.
- 5. Authorizing and approving the purchase of a Ford F150 vehicle for the Police Department and expenditure of \$28,000 from the Fiscal Year 2017-18 budget.
- 6. Approving amendments to the Annual Budget adopted for Fiscal Year 2016-17 for the Capital Project Fund, Building Fund, Water and Sewer Fund and Stormwater Fund.

- 7.Approving an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Tourist Resort Fund annual budget to appropriate and release reserves to the Tourist Board Fiscal Year 2017-2018 promotional activities account in the amount of \$115,000 for funding of post-hurricane marketing activities.
- 8. Approving a lease agreement with Dell Financial Services for the lease of computer equipment in the amount of \$80,698.80 over a three-year lease term.
- 9. Declaring as surplus certain computer equipment of the Town of Surfside and authorizing the Town Manager to provide for the sale or disposition of the surplus equipment. and providing for an effective date.
- 10. Approving and adopting water and sewer rates and service charges effective October 1, 2017.
- 11. Approving and adopting stormwater utility rates effective October 1, 2017.

#### **VOTED TO ADOPT AN ORDINANCE ON SECOND READING**


## Town Hall Lobby an Official 'Meetup Spot'


