Political Campaign Signs

The Town of Surfside regulates the use of political campaign signs under our Zoning Codes, Section 90-74, Temporary Signs. Political campaign signs may be displayed in both the residential and business districts.

Political campaign signs may not be erected or displayed more than 90 days prior to the subject election date or ballot vote, and all signs must be removed no later than seven (7) days after the subject election or ballot date. In the case where a candidate is a participant in a run-off election, the candidate's political campaign signs may be displayed until such time as the run-off election is concluded.

Political campaign signs must be professionally lettered, and may not be lighted or illuminated in any manner. Political campaign signs may be not affixed or attached in any manner to the surface of any public street, public right-of-way, easement, sidewalk, curb, street pole, or any other public property or public place. Any campaign sign so affixed or attached to any public property will be removed and destroyed by the Town without prior notice to the political campaign.

For residential and business districts, the maximum sign size is three (3) square feet. For in-ground signs, the maximum sign height including support frame is 42 inches from the ground to the top of the sign. In residential districts, only one political campaign sign is permitted per street frontage. Signs may not obstruct roadway visibility. Total signage, including political signs, placed in a window in the business district may not exceed 20% of the window.

Prior to posting any political campaign sign, the political candidate must first obtain the permission of the property owner to post a political sign where the sign is to be placed. Signs placed on private property without the consent of the property owner may be removed and destroyed. Signs may not be placed on vacant lots or vacant properties without the expressed consent of the property owner. At this time, the Town of Surfside does not require a political campaign sign bond.

Surfside's First Quarter Tourism Marketing Results

At the completion of the 2017-18 Fiscal Year first quarter, the Tourism Bureau is pleased to share marketing actions and subsequent results. In total, 18 articles were posted to our blog at VisitSurfsidefl.com, 75 social media posts, five electronic newsletters were sent, 40 press articles were published about Surfside, as well as our print advertising in *Indulge* Magazine's December edition, Greater Miami Visitors and Convention Bureau Visitors Guide and Vacation Planner and a targeted pay-per-click campaign. Combining all of these initiatives more than 66 million impressions were made in these three months, targeting local, national and international visitors. We also completed an updated 2018 Visitors Guide which is now available in addition to the outdoor banners in the Downtown District for the holidays. Moving forward, we will continue to present Surfside as Miami's Uptown Beachtown and wellness destination to the world.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR: TUESDAY, MAR. 20, 2018 IS ELECTION DAY

On March 20, 2018 Surfside will hold a special election and general election. In addition to electing the Mayor and all four Commissioners for two-year terms, the Town will consider the following Charter Amendment on the ballot. Plan now to vote on this important amendment.

The Charter provides for Mayor and Commissioners to be elected to two year terms, with the Commissioner receiving the most votes becoming Vice Mayor. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to retain a two year term for Mayor, while providing for transition to four year, staggered terms for Commissioners beginning in 2020, and for Vice Mayor to be selected by the Commission from among its members.

PROTECT OUR BAY WATERS!

Nothing But Rain Should Go Down Stormwater Drains

Unlawful discharges into Surfside's stormwater system is one of the most damaging sources of pollution for our surrounding bay waters. The Surfside Public Works Department is working tirelessly to eliminate these inappropriate discharges into surface waters or storm sewers.

What is an illicit discharge? It is a pollutant other than storm water into a storm drain, a pipe, or other direct connection. Sources of illicit connections may include sanitary sewer connections, wash water from washing machines and t home car washing. In addition, used motor oil and auto fluids, fertilizers, leaves, grass clippings and other pollutants can be swept into storm drains during rain events.

Residents are reminded to bag all loose vegetation. Using leaf blowers to blow debris or other material into the storm drain is **strictly prohibited** and can lead to dire consequences.





This marker reminds residents not to allow anything but water to go down storm drains.

If you observe illegal dumping, please report it to either Public Works, Code Compliance or Police Department at 305-861-4863.

Public Works and the Water and Sewer Department reminds residents and visitors to be aware of the markers identifying the Town's storm drains. Everyone should do their part in educating others of the severe hazards of illegally dumping down these drains. Let's all work to keep Surfside and our Bay clean.

DECEMBER 2017 OFFICERS OF THE MONTH

Detective Goes Undercover to Make a Unlicensed Medical Practice Arrest

Surfside detectives were alerted of an employee at the Lemel Medical Spa who was reportedly practicing medicine without a license. Surfside Sgt. Marian Cruz and Lead Investigator Detective Diana Dulaney met with the Miami-Dade Police Department's (MDPD) Medical Crimes Unit and the Florida Department of Health Miami Office to coordinate an investigation and undercover operation.

Det. Dulaney made an appointment at the spa to receive Juvederm and Botox injections. On November 15, she entered the spa accompanied by an undercover police officer from MDPD. Sgt. Cruz, Det. Kemuel Gambirazio and members of the MDPD Medical Crimes Unit surrounded the business.

Det. Dulaney met with the subject and obtained the necessary elements of a crime. The subject offered to administer injections right away. Det. Dulaney agreed and then gave the takedown signal for the undercover units to enter the spa.

The coordination, witness interviews and securing, categorizing and collecting evidence was directed by Sgt. Cruz, while Det. Kemuel Gambirazio took written statements from all the employees on scene. Detectives collected, photographed and impounded approximately \$5,000 of prescription drugs.

The subject was arrested and charged with one count of practicing medicine without a license and three counts of possession of prescription drug with intent to dispense. Additional arrests and penalties to the business are pending.

The detectives were commended for the success of this challenging operation as well as handling the significant media inquiries and interviews. Their outstanding work may have prevented serious injuries. Great job and congratulations!




